On October 6, 1908, on the same day that Austria announces that it will annex the Turkish providences of Bosnia and Hersegovina in defiance of European opinion, 24-year-old Roxbury, Massachusetts native Ándrew (Andy) O'Connor, pitching for the last-place New York Highlanders, makes his only major league appearance against the Boston Red Sox.

Acquired by the last-place Highlanders from the Trenton Tigers of the Tri-State (B) League earlier for an undisclosed amount of money, O'Connor strikes out five en route to pitching a complete game, but walks seven, yields 15 hits and is accorded "miserable support" in an 11-3 loss to the Red Sox at Boston's Huntington Avenue Grounds

O'Connor's mound opponent on the third to last day of the 1908 regular season is another Massachusetts native making

what will also be his only major league appearance, Henry (Doc) McMahon, a "fine, healthy broth of a boy". McMahon, from nearby Woburn and the College of the Holy Cross, also hurls a complete game, allowing three runs on 15 hits.
