of 8,000 in the Baker Bowl enables Roger Hornsby's Redbirds to move into a virtual tie for first place with the Cincinnati Reds.

Starting pitcher Jack Knight and relievers Mike Kelly, Ed Baecht and Ray Pierce were each "battered from the box" before Rambo succeeds in getting the final two outs.
