BASEBALL PLAYERS HANG MAN

Former National League Stars Do Their Duty as Allegheny County Officials.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., July 23.—Adison C. Gumbert, formerly a star pitcher of the Chicago National League team but now sheriff of Allegheny County, hanged his first man today, assisted by another former National League star, Edward Swartwood, who used to cavort around the middle field for the Pirates, and who is now deputy sheriff.

The victim was Dowling Green, a negro wife murderer. Gumbert did not fancy taking the negro's life, nor anyone else, for that matter, and so rigged up an arrangement by which Green practically hanged himself.
