It's Never Over Until It's Over

Athletics Score 13 Runs In Eight Inning to Win From Cleveland 17 to 15

Trailing the Cleveland Indians 12-2 in the sixth inning, Philadelphia relief pitcher Tom Glass is brought in by manager Connie Mack to "mop up" ... however, Glass picks up his only major league victory when the Athletics rally for 13 runs in the bottom of the eighth inning for a 17-15 win.

In the second, and what will be his last major league appearance, the 27-year-old Greensboro, N.C., native allows three runs (two earned) on seven hits and one strikeout in three innings of relief before he is pinch hit for by Sammy Hale during the A's eighth-inning rally.

One week later, on June 22, Mack releases Glass along with another rookie, catcher Jimmy Foxx ... for Glass, his major league playing days are over, but Foxx will return the major league's to hit .325 with 534 home runs with 1,922 RBIs in a 20-year-old Hall of Fame career.
