Morrison I & II

Despite the presence of two obviously highlytalented Morrisons in the opposing lineups, the Winnipeg Tribune calls Moose Jaw's 2-1 win over Winnipeg "a rather listless exhibition of baseball."

Moose Jaw twirler Harry "Hy" Morrison limits Winnipeg to four hits while striking out seven and walking three en route to picking up his third win of the season. Center fielder Gene "Lefty" Morrison collects one of the five hits allowed by his name counterpart and drives in the Maroons only run. Signing with Winnipeg 26 games into the season (June 9), Morrison, a World War I veteran who saw action in France, will hit only .229 in 80 games for Jack Sheehan's Maroons.

On April 25, 1923, the St. Paul Saints release Morrison after two seasons despite the Indianapolis News calling the left-handed hitting veteran "probably the greatest outfielder in the game."

Morrison III

Third baseman Bob Morrison goes 1-for-3 and scores three times as the City Team shuts out the winless Car Shop team 18-0, in an early-season Tyrone (Pa.) City League game. Newspaper reports the following day report that the Car Shop team "tried to out-do each other and see who could make the widest heaves. They looked like
