

## SENATORS DEFEAT BOSTON RED SOX

After First Four Innings Game Develops Into a Farce.

On the final day of the 1913 season, Washington Senators' manager Clark Griffith starts star pitcher Walter Johnson in center field.

Johnson, who garnered his 36th victory of the season five days earlier with a 1-0 four-hit shutout of Philadelphia, is 2-for-3 with a double, two stolen bases and two runs scored before being summoned to relieve Germany Schaefer in the ninth inning.

The future Hall of Fame right-hander allows two runs on a pair of hits before being relieved by Eddie Ainsmith and finishing the game at second base. In all, the Senators use 18 players, including the 43-year-old Griffith, who pitches a scoreless eighth inning.

Johnson ends the season with 1.09 ERA and it remains that way for more than 70 years until it's discovered that those two ninth-inning runs against the Red Sox had been omitted from the season's final statistics. Johnson's ERA is officially raised to 1.145, which drops him from third to fifth among the best single-season ERA marks since 1900.
