The Texas League game ends in a scoreless tie after 15 innings, called on account of darkness.

Lower strikes out seven and walks only one in his 15 innings of work and field his position flawlessly with nary an error on 12 assists. Dallas' Marvin Bridges allows eight hits, walks only one while striking out 13.
