## **On This Date**

"Mike Corcoran, a brother to Larry, pitched for the Chicago club in one game against Detroit. The score was 14-0 in favor of Detroit, and Mike went home satisfied that he was not a pitcher." - St. Louis Post-Dispatch, July 23, 1884

In his only major league appearance, Mike Corcoran pitches a complete game for the Chicago White Stockings against the Detroit Wolverines - the worst team in the National League - before 700 fans in the Motor City's Recreation Park.

The older brother of White Sox ace Larry Corcoran, he walks seven, allows 16 hits, including an eighth-inning home run to right-center by George Wood, and uncorks five wild pitches in a less-than-memorable nine inning performance.

"There is a strong resemblance between the brothers in feature, stature and action, but not in effectiveness." - Detroit Free Press

Corcoran also commits seven of the team's 17 errors and is hitless in his three at bats. His pitch count in this two-hour, nine minute contest is probably close to 190 - 117 balls called, 17 strikes called, 16 strikes missed (presuming a swing and miss), 17 errors and 16 hits.
