The New Castle Nocks, on the strength of a six-hit complete game by future major leaguer **Harry Camnitz** (right), avoid dropping into the cellar of the eight-team Ohio-Pennsylvania (C) League with a 2-1 victory over first-place Akron. Five of Akron's six hits are infield singles.



Harry (1) and his older brother Howie (133) combine for 134 wins at the major league level.

The New Castle Herald reports that the Nocks, mired in seventh place with a 24-40 mark, may be bought by Doc Read, the team's travelling secretary. If that occurs, player/manager Pete Porter will have to look for a new job as it is reported that Read is "strongly opposed" to Porter remaining as manager. The following afternoon Porter is fired and replaced by "Kid" Hagen. Porter is 24-41 (.369) as the New Castle manager, while Hagen is 23-29 (.442).
