## October 2, 1949 Ed Albrecht's five-inning debut...

In the second game of a seasonending doubleheader between the St. Louis Browns and the Chicago White Sox, 20-year-old Brown rookie right hander Ed Albrecht throws a one-hitter in his major league debut ... in a game that is called at the end of the fifth inning because of darkness, Albrecht strikes out one and walks four in a 5-3 victory.

Albrecht earns his season-ending call-up with the Browns following a record-breaking performance with the Pine Bluff Cardinals of the Cotton States (C) League, where he wins 29 games and strikes out 389 batters (in 332 innings), both single-season records for the league.

Debuting with a 5-1 mark as a 17-year-old for the Bristol Twins of the Appalachian (D) League in 1945, Albrecht will pitch eight years in the minors, compiling a 87-67 record with a 3.91 ERA ... after playing with a semi-pro team in Baldwin, Missouri, the entire 1952 season, Albrecht attempts a Ed Albrecht's Debut October 2, 1949

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 2 (P)—A rookie did what nine seasoned hurlers couldn't do today — win a ball game for the St. Louis Browns. Ed Albrecht, in his first appearance for the seventh place team, defeated the Chicago White Sox 5-3 in the second game of a doubleheader after the Sox took the first game, 4-3, facing a different St. Louis hurler in each inning.
