On September 12, 1946, in the second game of a doubleheader against the Chicago Cubs, 28-year-old Philadelphia Phillies rookie pitcher Aloysius Joseph (Eli) Hodkey relieves Hugh "Losing Pitcher" Mulcahy with two outs in the fifth inning ... pitching 2 1/3 scoreless innings, Hodkey is lifted for a pinch hitter (Ron Northey) in the eighth inning of an eventual 5-4 loss in 10 innings before 6,848 fans at Shibe Park.

For the World War II Army Air Corps veteran, his relief stint against the Cubs is the first of only two major league appearances in a nine-year professional baseball career ... 16 days later (September 28) Hodkey makes his first career start, but the second and final appearance of his major league career, allowing six runs on seven hits and two walks over two innings in a 8-2 loss to the last-place New York Giants.

Born on November 3, 1917, in Lorain, Ohio, a 19-year-old Hodkey signs with the Boston Red Sox in September, 1937, after pitching a three-hitter for the Lorain Dusky Brothers in the National Amateur Tournament.

Hodkey fashions a 87-59 mark in nine minor league seasons highlighted by a 15-8 mark with a 1.96 ERA in 1942 for the Scranton Red Sox ... following the 1942 season, Hodkey is the first player selected in annual Rule V Draft of minor league players by the Philadelphia Phillies ... unable to locate the slave.

minor league players by the Philadelphia Phillies ... unable to locate the slender lefthander in the weeks following the draft, the Phillies finally find him in the employment of Uncle Sam at Camp Perry in Port Clinton, Ohio ... Hodkey serves

three years (1943-45) in the Army

Air Corp during World War II.

Returning from the military in 1946, Hodkey is 13-7 in 26 games with the Utica Red Sox before he is a late-season September call up by the Phillies.

On March 3, 1950, Hodkey's career comes to an end with he and veteran pitcher Jim Bagby, Jr., are released by the Southern (AA) League's Atlanta Crackers.

Following his baseball career, Hodkey works at the U.S. Steel's Lorain Works as a bridge operator and relief foreman for 32 years, retiring in 1980 ... following a three-year illness, Hodkey dies on August 30, 2005, in his hometown at the age of 87.
