## April 16, 1935 Lusty Home Run

Oakland Oaks left fielder Stanley Keyes hits a "lusty" 3-run sixth-inning home run over the left field fence keying the Oaks to a 5-2 win over the Mission Reds in a Pacific Coast League game ... one of the more prolific home run hitters in PCL history (344), the 36-year-old Keyes hits .293 in the 1935 with 38 doubles, five triples and a team-high 17 home runs.

Just moments before the start of the game, Eddie Mulligan, Oakland's veteran third sacker, is sold to the Missions ... the 40-year-old Mulligan "jumped" into a Reds uniform and in the bottom of the first inning robs his replacement, 20-yearold Oak 3B Frankie Hawkins, of a single.

> Stanley Keyes, Oak left fielder, again proved the hero yesterday with a lusty home run over the left field wall in the sixth inning to score Tobin and Leroy Anton, had walked. Until that who mighty smash, Hollis Thurston had turned the Oaks back scoreless with only two hits, and his mates gave him 2 one-run lead in the fifth when Al Wright got a life on second when Keith Molesworth tossed low to first and Clyde Beck singled.
