


Lloyd and Paul Waner combine for four hits in eight at bats and drive in four runs as Pittsburgh, aided by four Dodger miscues, salvages the final game of a three game series with a 6-3 win over the visiting Brooklyn Dodgers before a small crowd of 2,500 at Forbes Field.

The loss is the fourth-straight for Mungo, who is so upset with the errors that following the game he stages a "one man rebellion" leaving the team and returning to Brooklyn.

Mungo later calms down and returns to the mound three days later and hurls a 13-inning complete game 3-2 win over the St. Louis Cardinals.

During the course of the season both the Chicago Cubs and Cardinals inquire as to Mungo's availability ... Dodger manager Casey Stengel tells Chicago that the 26-year-old right hander is available for \$150,000 while Cardinals are told that Mungo can be had in exchange for pitcher Dizzy Dean and second baseman Stu Martin.

Thus the Pageland, South Carolina, right hander remains a Dodger until December 4, 1941 when he and Tony Giuliani are traded to the New York Giants for Joe Hatten.

COACH WALKER READY FOR FOOTBALL DRILLS

 Elon College, Aug. 27.—There is no vacation for Coach D. C. "Pea-head" Walker. On September 1 he will start training his ninth football team at Elon college, after leaving Williamston, on August 31, where he has been piloting the baseball team there in a successful summer in the Coastal Plain league.

For nine years this "iron man" has been coaching football in the fall, basketball in mid-winter, and baseball in the spring and managing baseball teams in the summer months.
