

Babe Ruth Fails to Aid Athletics But They Win, 5-4

PHILADELPHIA, March liabe Ruth, home run slugger of the New York Yankees, played left field for Connie Mack's Athletics in exhibition game against Milwaukes Wednesday at Port Myers, Fla., but the Bambine's hitting did not figure in the Athletics' 5 to 4 victory. The liabe whaled the ball three times, but the best he could get was three infield grounders, which were easy outs. On his other trip to plate he was passed and scored on Hauser's triple. About 5,000 fans. one of the largest crowds that ever turned out for a sports event Fort Moyers, witnessed the game. Pierce, Milwaukee left fielder, had four hits in five trips to the plate
