

## **Newell Kimball**

Ponca City's <u>Newell Kimball</u> pitches a nohitter in his organized baseball debut in a 7-0 "masterpiece" against the Hutchinson Larks in a Western (C) Association contest.

The 19-year-old right-hander wins 20 games for Ponca City that season before being called up to the Pacific Coast League's Los Angeles Angels. He makes his PCL debut on September 24, against Sacramento, allowing only two hits over four scoreless innings.

A native of Santa Monica, California, Kimball will make his major league debut on May 7, 1937, with the Chicago Cubs. In six major league seasons with the Cubs, Brooklyn Dodgers, St. Louis Cardinals and

the Philadelphia Phillies, Newell is 11-9 with a 3.78 ERA with four complete games and five saves.



## **Jack Quinn**

After six less-than-stellar appearances, 50-yearold right-hander <u>Jack Quinn</u> is released by the PCL's Hollywood Stars.

The noted spitballer pitches 23 seasons in three different major leagues, finishing with a 247-218 mark and a 3.29 ERA. The <u>Stefurov, Slovakia</u>, native will pitch one more game in 1935 with the Johnston Johnnies of the Mid-Atlantic (C) League. Overall, Quinn wins 348 games in 29 seasons.
