## Kau the Goliath

The Chinese University of Honolulu, Hawaii, continues its successful tour of the mainland, defeating the Baylor College Bears 4-0 behind Nelson Kau's perfect game.

Kau, a "giant" of a pitcher with an "excellent spitter" strikes out 22 and does not allow a Baylor batter to reach first base or a ball to be hit out of the infield.

Baylor, under the direction of C.P. "Bubs" Mosley, will go on to finish its collegiate season with a 10-10 mark, including a 5-7 mark in the Southwest Conference.

## CHINESE PITCHER FANS 22 BATTERS

Allowed No Hits, Not a Runner  
First and Ball Never Left  
the Infield.

No-hit games are fairly common in collegiate ball, but the performance of Kau, the new star of the Chinese University, at Waco, Tex., on April 6, has never been equalled in collegiate ball and it is likely that the mark will not be touched for years to come. Kau's performance was registered against one of the strongest college teams in the country, the Baylor College aggregation. Baylor turns out many great ball players, many of whom are now in the major leagues, and this season's team is as strong as the usual run. Yet Baylor not only failed to get a hit or run off Kau, but not a player reached first base, 22 men were retired on strikes, and not a ball was hit out of the infield.

### Kau's Tour Chronology

March 28 - Kau goes the distance, allowing only five hits in a 3-2 loss to the San Antonio Bronchos of the Texas (B) League in an exhibition game at the Bronchos' League Park ... the *San Antonio Light* describes Kau as, "a giant, his ancestors coming from the northern part of China, where they make them as big as Goliath."

April 4 - Kau pitches another complete game in a 4-2 win over the Phoenix "Pickups" ... the *Arizona Republican* notes, "One advantage they (the Chinese team) had over the English speaking players came when ever Phoenix had a base runner on base, they would relapse into their native tongue or tongues, and the base runner never knew what was on their minds."

April 21 - Kau allows only three hits and strikes out 11 in a 3-0 win over the University of Missouri.
